

As the Earth House Ambassadors continue to develop the College site to support biodiversity, we hope to encourage as many different species of bird to our campus as possible.



On Wednesday 29th January the Earth House Ambassadors took part in the RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch. This important citizen science project is the world's largest garden wildlife survey and over the past 45 years, volunteers from across the UK have helped the RSPB by tracking the birds living in their gardens and local green spaces. Since the survey began in 1979, a more than 172 million birds have been counted.

Staff and students recorded 24 different species of birds on our site during this year's Big Garden Birdwatch!

#### Design and Technology in Partnership with Earth House

This term we have focused on designing and building an astronomical clock. We have taken inspiration from the clocks that can been found in many beautiful locations around the world; the clocks that chart the turning of each year.

We are making steady progress. Our clock is designed to show how the summer and winter solstice affect day length at Frome's latitude. As part of the project, student have used Meccano to think about the mechanism required for the design to work accurately throughout the year.

Becoming a 'Green Connector' means that we have considered how our own health is directly related to that of our planet. We have explored how maintaining our own mental and physical health is not only good for us but reduces the impact we have on our environment throughout our lives.
