Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

I hope that you all had a restful half term; it was excellent to see so many Year 11 students attend revision sessions over the half term holiday. Our Easter revision conferences to support both Year 11 and 13 will begin on Monday 7th April and run through until Thursday 17th April. Details on what subject sessions are available and how students sign up to attend will be released after the second round of mocks are completed in early March.

Good luck to our students entering the Young Chef competition and those AIM students competing in 'Made in Somerset' on Thursday. Lots of time and energy have been spent on preparation and we are very confident our students will do well.

Mock exams

Year 11 mock exams start on Tuesday 25th February and continue through to Friday 7th March. Students have been briefed on general expectations around the exams and the need to produce their issued ID badge in accordance with national examination rules.

Students should return to normal lessons after morning exams and should be in all lessons around exams. Students may leave site early on completion of exams in the afternoon session or wait to catch buses in College Hall. Any student without a calculator for their exams should see Mr Robson during morning registration to pick one up for the exams period.

Year 13 then sit their mock exams from the week beginning 10th March. There will be no Year 13 lessons during that week.

SEND Coffee Morning

Our SEND department is hosting a coffee morning from 9.15 am to 11.15 am on Tuesday 25th February in the foyer of the Merlin; please do come to College for an informal chat with the staff in the SEND department. There is no need to book for this event.

This is an informal opportunity for you to find out more about how we support students with dyslexia or dyslexic tendencies in College and to gain advice on how you can support your child at home.
