#### Update on the Implementation of Arbor

As part of our ongoing commitment to improving communication and streamlining processes within our schools, I am pleased to provide an update on the implementation of Arbor, our new management information system (MIS).

We are working diligently towards the planned rollout of Arbor on 1 April 2025. Significant progress has been made in preparing for this transition and we are confident that the system will bring numerous benefits to both the school and our families. Arbor is designed to enhance how we manage and share essential information, ensuring a more efficient and effective experience for all.

#### **Implementation Process**

- Access to Information: View your child's attendance records, progress and key dates via the Arbor Parent Portal or app.
- Improved Communication: Receive updates, reminders, and messages directly to your registered email or app notifications.
- Online Payments: A simplified process for managing payments for school meals, trips, and other events will be available later in the new academic year 2025/26.

#### **Next Steps**

As we move closer to the rollout date, we will be in touch again with detailed information about how Arbor will interface with parents and carers. This will include instructions on how to access and use the Arbor Parent Portal, as well as guidance on its key features. Our goal is to ensure a smooth transition and to provide you with the support needed to make the most of this new system.
