Why is revision important?

We know that the next few months may feel daunting. After all, you have been working since your first year in school towards these exams and it is normal to feel worried and to want to do your best. Revision is a guaranteed way to help you feel less anxious, more prepared and face your exams with more confidence.

There are many ways to revise but there are some tried and tested ways to help you retain the information you'll need over the coming weeks. The 'Ace your Exams' workshop will help you with some revision strategies and many of you have been learning different ways to study independently in your subject classes.

Why can't I just study on my own?

Sometimes, independent and unregulated study is not always very effective. There isn't always a dedicated peaceful space at home which can make study really tricky. How long should a student revise for? Distraction and a lack of routine are the most common barriers to home revision.

How to book

1. Head to Frog
2. Scroll to the tab 'Easter Revision Booking'
3. Choose the appropriate session and hit book
4. Keep an eye on ClassCharts. This is where you'll receive up to date information and a reminder about the session you have booked.

If a session has been removed from the booking form, it probably means it is full. **Remember not to double book yourself and only book sessions you intend on coming to.**

On the Day

There are a few pieces of information we would like to make sure you know.

Uniform: You definitely do not need to wear your uniform.

Stationery : Please bring anything that you would normally take to school, especially your pens, calculators etc.

Start time: Please arrive on time so the teacher can start your session promptly.

As much as we know you love being in school, you'll need to leave the site when your session has finished.

Food on site: The canteen is closed. Please bring snacks and a drink (or lunch) if you are staying all day.

If you have free school meals, we will be providing a cold lunch and snacks. Please collect this from E11 each day. We need to know numbers, so please fill in the google form that you'll receive in ClassCharts.

ClassCharts: For all up to date information and room changes, please check ClassCharts. We will communicate any last minute changes here.

First aid: There will be no first aid on site. In the event of an emergency we will call home and an ambulance if necessary. It is really important that you are registered with a teacher so we know you are on site.
