



### Staying safe over the Christmas holiday

We are writing to ask you to keep yourselves and the wider community safe and healthy over this Christmas holiday.

We know that lots of you enjoy the parks and family spaces Frome has to offer but remember they are for everybody and need to be kept safe and clean for all in our community. Public services continue to work hard to keep everyone safe and everyone has to play their part and take responsibility for their own behaviour socially.

At the moment, Frome is in Tier 2 and we all need to work together to prevent any further restrictions. Tier 2 means:

- you must not socialise with anyone you do not live with or who is not in your support bubble in any indoor setting, whether at home or in a public place
- you must not socialise in a group of more than 6 people outside, including in a garden or a public space – this is called the 'rule of 6'

This is not a time to place unnecessary pressure on the NHS nor the Police by breaking these rules. It is also important to remember that most families will include people who could become seriously ill if they catch COVID-19. Should you or your family need advice over the holiday period we have attached some local and national help lines overleaf. We all wish you a happy, safe and restful holiday.


